DEVELOPING SKILLS

- Familiarity with the individual or small group you are talking to always makes it easier.
- Unfamiliarity makes it a little more difficult
 - Again, the more it is done, the easier it becomes
 - Though people can be very different one from another, nevertheless, we all have commonalities that we relate to
 - Examples: Likes/dislikes, fears, experiences, emotions



DEVELOPING SKILLS



- Unless you are in a lecturing/teaching situation, you must always be ready to listen
- Proper, friendly deportment is always in order (Proverbs 18:19)
- There is no enabler greater than the Holy Ghost who is interested in your entire life (because you represent Him)

THINGS THAT CRIPPLE COMMUNICATION

- Lack of knowledge of subject matter
- Arrogance
- Revealing of one's fear or intimidation
- Improper use of words and/or grammar
- Dull subject matter
- Good subject matter presented dully



TIPS FOR EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATION

- Practice speaking in private
 - Winston Churchill
- Read out loud to yourself
- Don't be squeamish
- Continually enlarge your vocabulary
- If possible, practice with someone else willing to help you or who also needs practice
- As much as possible thoroughly “bone up” on subject matter and then let it out as “conversationally” as possible
 - Edmond Burke & Winston Churchill
- Whenever you read a gripping or powerful thought or statement or quote, write it down, keep it, and if possible, memorize it
